ISO Standardization of the FIX Session



The Fast Track process should reduce time and the amount of labor required.


The Fast Track process does not require creation of a working group in SC9 for FIX Session Layer standard development.

TC 68/ SC 9/WG1 is focused on developing a semantic representation of ISO 20022. This work expanded to provide a multi-standard semantic portal ("MSSP") based upon a semantic representation of the ISO 20022 meta model. The technical report TR 22126 is provided in several parts.
